## **NURSE PRACTITIONER**

### **DIVISION: EDUCATION**

#### **OBJECTIVE:**

The Nurse Practitioner will be responsible for managing all aspects of clinical services offered at the Men's Health and Wellness Center (MHWC).

#### **ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Ensure that HIV/STD testing protocols are implemented and reviewed/updated as needed.

Administer and/or prescribe treatment for program participants who test positive for Syphilis, Gonorrhea and Chlamydia.

Administer Hepatitis A and B vaccinations as needed.

Work closely with MHWC staff to ensure appropriate prevention, treatment referrals and linkages are provided to MHWC clientele.

Supervise all clinical staff, volunteers, residents and/or interns.

Prepare reports and statistics as requested.

Maintain client health files to ensure that all documentation as required by funders is in client's chart.

Develop and implement Quality Management Plan for MHWC.

#### **REQUIREMENTS:**

Training and Experience:



Must currently be board certified as a Nurse Practitioner through the California Board of Registered Nursing with at least 3 years experience working independently in a clinic setting or 3 years running a clinic. One year of supervisory experience of trainees and interns required.

Knowledge of:

HIV/STD related health issues; DSM IV; various theoretical orientations; treatment modalities; clinical techniques and interventions; treatment planning; bio-psychosocial assessment; and crisis intervention. Practical applications in clinical supervision required; reporting obligations.

Ability to:

Effectively work with persons infected with and affected by HIV/AIDS; communicate effectively orally and in writing; organize work in an effective manner; work in a collaborative, interdisciplinary, fast paced work environment; work effectively independently and as part of a team; communicate and relate to a variety of personalities, ethnicities, and sexual orientations. The ability to provide individual and group clinical supervision to trainees and interns is required. The ability to effectively communicate in Spanish is preferred.

#### **WORKING CONDITIONS/PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:**

This is primarily an office position that requires only occasional bending, reaching, stooping, lifting and moving of office materials weighing 25 pounds or less. Some driving (or other form of transportation) is also required. The position requires daily use of a personal computer and requires entering, viewing, and revising text and graphics on the computer terminal and on paper. Some weekend and weeknight hours required to attend special events and meetings. Some domestic travel might be required.

#### **SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:**

Must possess a valid California driver's license; proof of auto liability insurance; and have the use of a personal vehicle for work-related purposes.
